Please note that interview requests will not be granted on the day before an event, or on the day of an event. A post-game press conference will take place in Room 122 of the U.S. Century Bank Arena after each home game, featuring Head Coach Cindy Russo and select student-athletes.

GAMEDAY SERVICES

Media seating is available opposite the scorer's table at the U.S. Century Bank Arena. Please inform Maegan Azpiazu at least 24 hours in advance of the game if you will be attending -- this includes photographers. The U.S. Century Bank Arena is equipped for radio broadcasts; please contact Azpiazu at least one week in advance to ensure availability. Wireless internet is available at the U.S. Century Bank Arena, free of charge.

GAME NOTES

FIU women's basketball game notes will be posted in PDF format on the women's basketball homepage at www.FIUSports.com, the official website of the FIU Panthers. Notes for the weekend will be posted as they are completed and an archived list of notes will accumulate throughout the season. Updated statistics will be available at each game.

CREDENTIALS/PARKING

All credential requests must be made to Maegan Azpiazu at least 24 hours in advance. There is no designated media parking, however, parking is available in the Panther Parking Garage or across the street from the west side of the U.S. Century Bank Arena. Media will-call will open one hour before tip-off, and all media should enter through Gate 4.

Photographers are asked to use good judgement and to exercise caution when photographing women's basketball games in the U.S. Century Bank Arena. Please keep out of the bench areas and adhere to any additional signage on the court.

U.S. CENTURY BANK ARENA

From Miami International Airport

Take SR 836 West (Dolphin Expressway) to the NW 107th Avenue/South exit. Proceed south on 107th Avenue to SW 8th Street (SR 41/Tamiami Trail). Turn right on 8th Street, two traffic lights to SW 112th Avenue. Turn left onto the FIU campus and then make right-hand turns at the first two stop signs. The U.S. Century Bank Arena will be on your left.

From I-95

Traveling north or south on I-95, exit at SR 836 West (Dolphin Expressway) to NW 107th Avenue/South exit. Proceed south on 107th Avenue to SW 8th Street (SR 41/Tamiami Trail). Turn right on 8th Street, two traffic lights to SW 112th Avenue. Turn left onto the FIU campus and then go right at the first two stop signs. The U.S. Century Bank Arena will be on your left.

From the Palmetto Expressway (SR 826)

Traveling north or south on the Palmetto Expressway, exit westbound on SW 8th Street (SR 41/Tamiami Trail). Proceed to SW 112th Avenue. Turn left onto the FIU campus and then go right at the first two stop signs. The U.S. Century Bank Arena will be on your left.

From the Florida Turnpike

Traveling north or south on the Turnpike, exit eastbound on SW 8th Street (No. 25/Tamiami Trail). Turn right onto 8th Street (SR 41/Tamiami Trail). At SW 112th Avenue, turn right onto the FIU campus, and then go right at the first two stop signs. The U.S. Century Bank Arena will be on your left.

In 37 years of women's basketball at FIU, Head Coach Cindy Russo has been the driving force for 33 of them. Over that time, she has guided FIU to 22-consecutive winning seasons (1981-2003) and at least 20 victories on 18 occasions. Russo has led her teams to six NCAA Division I Tournament berths, six postseason Women's National Invitation Tournaments (WNIT) and two NCAA Division II Tournaments, in addition to winning eight regular season conference titles and seven tournament crowns.

For her career, Russo has amassed a career record of 670-351 in 35 seasons, and comes into the 2012-13 campaign with a record of 630-329 across 33 seasons at FIU. Russo has coached seven All-Americans during her tenure with the Panthers, including 2012 AP All-American Jerica Coley.

In 2011-12, Russo led FIU to an overall record of 23-11, as the Panthers posted their second-straight, 10-win Sun Belt Conference season and advanced to their second-consecutive SBC Championship semifinal. FIU earned an at-large bid to the Postseason WNIT, advancing to the postseason event for the first time since 2005-06, as the Panthers hosted their third-ever postseason basketball game, defeating Stetson, 75-47, in Miami before falling at USF. The season also saw standout guard Jerica Coley rank as high as No. 2 in the nation in scoring, as she became the first player in FIU women's basketball history to be named SBC Player of the Year en route to All-America honors. Coley and teammate Fanni Hutlassa both joined the 1,000-Point Club that season, becoming the third duo in program history to achieve 1,000-career points in the same season.

The previous season, Russo earned her 600th victory at FIU with a 62-59 victory over Middle Tennessee on Jan. 29, 2011. Led by Coley, who became just the second freshman in school history to score 500 points in a season, the Panthers finished second in the SBC East Division and third overall, going on to advance to the SBC Tournament semifinals for the first time since 2005-06. FIU finished the 2010-11 campaign with an overall record of 16-16 and a regular season mark of 10-6 in league play, marking the program's first 10-win conference season in nine years. In 2006-07, Russo joined elite company by becoming the 16th women's basketball head coach to win 600 career games after her Panthers defeated Central Connecticut, 73-51, on Dec. 23, 2006. Russo later received the Babe Didrickson Zaharias Award from the Sports Society at the 24th annual Women Athletes Reach for the Stars awards banquet for her efforts.

The 2005-06 season saw Russo guide the Panthers into the postseason, as FIU advanced to the semifinals of the SBC Tournament behind the firepower of First Team All-SBC selection Lasma Jekabsone, FIU then received its fifth invitation to the WNIT and the Panthers hosted their second postseason basketball game, going on to earn a preliminary-round overtime victory over the BIG EAST's Cincinnati before falling at cross-town rival Miami.

In 2001-02, Russo picked up her 500th-career victory with a win over Stephen F. Austin in the Preseason WNIT. After that impressive feat, she went on to lead the Panthers to their first SBC regular season and tournament crowns, and sixth NCAA Division I Tournament appearance. That season, Russo picked up her first SBC Coach of the Year accolade and eighth overall such honor, as FIU finished the regular season ranked in the top 25 in both the Associated Press and USA Today polls.

The Panthers began competition in the Sun Belt Conference in 1998-99 after spending eight years in the Trans America Athletic Conference. FIU finished 23-7 overall and 9-3 in the conference, and was ranked in the top 25 for the third-consecutive season. With victories over Harvard, Washington and WKU, the Panthers made a third-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament and their first as an at-large selection.

FIU had its greatest season in the program's history in 1997-98 as the Panthers produced a 29-2 record, advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. FIU started the season with an 11-0 record, and, throughout the year, FIU defeated five NCAA Tournament teams – Purdue, Michigan, Georgia, Miami and Louisville. The Panthers, who failed to receive a vote in the preseason polls, climbed to No. 11 in the AP Poll and No. 12 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll. With a 59-45 victory over Marquette in the first round of NCAA Tournament play, Russo earned her 400th victory at FIU.

In 1993-94, Russo led her squad to a 25-4 record and the program's first NCAA Division I Tournament appearance. The following season, the Panthers continued to improve as they were picked as high as No. 16 in the preseason national polls. FIU finished the campaign with a mark of 27-5, winning an unprecedented fourth-straight TAAC regular season and tournament championship, and upsetting Old Dominion, 81-76, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

The women's basketball program first garnered national attention in 1991-92 when Russo guided FIU to a 23-10 mark in the program's first season in the TAAC. That team earned a berth to the postseason WNIT. One year later, she had only nine student-athletes on the roster, yet still managed a 25-6 record. FIU won the TAAC with a 12-0 record and outscored its conference opponents by 29.6 points per game, while making a second trip to the WNIT. Following that season, the team received mention in both the Associated Press and USA Today/CNN polls for the first time in school history.

Russo has coached seven All-Americans during her tenure at FIU and has had seven players compete professionally: Andrea Nagy (Sacramento Monarchs - WNBA), Dalma Ivanyi (San Antonio Silver Stars - WNBA), Gergana Branzova (Detroit Shock -- WNBA), Alben Branzova (New York Liberty -- WNBA), Gergana Slavtcheva (Phoenix Mercury - WNBA), Jennifer Bell (Colorado Xplosian -- ABL) and Lynette Richardson (Miami Tropics - USBL). Two of those players, Nagy and Alben Branzova, were selected to the TAAC 25th-Anniversary Team.

Russo began coaching at her alma mater, Old Dominion, as an assistant coach following a successful collegiate career. She spent two years assisting at ODU before taking the head coaching position at FIU as a graduate assistant for the 1977-78 season.

The following fall, Russo accepted the position of head coach at Lamar University in Beaumont, Texas, where she guided the Lady Cardinals to consecutive 20-11 seasons and AIAW playoff berths. She returned to FIU in 1980 and quickly turned the program around. In 1982, FIU enjoyed its first-ever winning season, compiling 27 wins to mark a 20-win improvement from the previous year, and capturing a ninth-place finish at the AIAW Nationals. For those accomplishments, Russo was selected as Florida's Coach of the Year.

A native of Portsmouth, Va., Russo received her bachelor's degree in health and physical education from Old Dominion in 1975. She was one of the first female student-athletes to receive athletic grant-in-aid at ODU, and garnered honorable mention honors on ODU's All-Time Lady Monarch squad, as voted on by fans on the University's athletic website, in 2006. In 1978, she earned her master's degree in physical education from FIU.

Fresh off her June 2012 induction into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, Inge Nissen enters her 24th season with the Panthers in 2012-13, as she has been essential to Head Coach Cindy Russo in recruiting and building a nationally-recognized women's basketball program at FIU.

After joining the FIU coaching staff as an assistant coach in 1989, Nissen was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 1992 season. Since then, Nissen and Russo have compiled an impressive 380-217 (.637) record, and have guided the Panthers to six NCAA Tournaments and six appearances in the Women's Postseason NIT.

A season ago, in 2011-12, Nissen helped guide FIU (23-11) to its first 20-win campaign in the last 10 years as the Panthers posted their second-straight, 10-win Sun Belt Conference season and advanced to their second-consecutive SBC Championship semifinal. FIU would then earn an at-large bid to the Postseason WNIT, advancing to the postseason event for the first time since 2005-06.

In addition to handling on-floor coaching, travel and budget, Nissen is responsible for establishing the European pipeline that has brought such players as All-Americans Albena Branzova, Andrea Nagy, Gergana Branzova and Dalma Ivanyi, as well as all-conference performers Tătană Pokorná, Zuzana Michalcova, Gergana Slavtcheva, Milena Tomova and Lasma Jekabsone to the program.

Prior to joining the coaching staff at FIU, Nissen had an outstanding playing career, both collegiately and professionally. A native of Denmark, Nissen was one of the top amateur players in Europe in the early 1970s. During that time, she played an important role on five national championship teams with Denmark (1972), Norway (1973) and France (1974, 1975 and 1985). In 1976, Russo – a former assistant coach at Old Dominion University – recruited Nissen to ODU.

Nissen helped the Lady Monarchs to a top-15 national ranking in each of her four years. She led Old Dominion to the WNIT Championship in 1978 as the team finished the season ranked No. 12 in the final Associated Press rankings. Nissen then capped her collegiate career by leading the Lady Monarchs to AIAW National Championships in 1979 and 1980. From 1976-80, Kodak, WNIT and the National Scouting Association honored Nissen as an All-American, and she was the team's MVP during the 1978, 1979 and 1980 seasons, as well as the Outstanding Female Athlete of the Year in 1980.

Nissen finished her career as the school's all-time leader in points (2,647) and rebounds (1,459) – marks that rank second in the ODU record book today. Her single-game career high of 28 rebounds remains a school record, as does her 148 free throws made in a single season and her 518 career made free throws. Twice, she scored more than 40 points in a game, and her 20 field goals made during the WNIT remains a tournament record. Eight times as a collegian, Nissen scored 32 points or more in a game, five of those times coming in the postseason.

In 1985, Nissen was inducted into the Old Dominion Hall of Fame, and her jersey, No. 42, is one of only five numbers to be retired by ODU. She was selected to ODU's All-Time Lady Monarch squad, as voted by fans on the University's athletic website, in 2006. Nissen was also honored as one of ESPN.com's top-25 players of the pre-NCAA era for her accomplishments with the Lady Monarchs.

Nissen received her bachelor's degree in French Literature from Old Dominion in 1990. She currently resides in Palmetto Bay, Fla., with her husband, Lance Bennett.

Desma Thomas Bateast enters her seventh season as an assistant coach with the FIU women's basketball program in 2012-13, fresh off her March 2012 induction into the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame.

Thomas Bateast has been an integral part of Head Coach Cindy Russo's staff for six seasons and for the past two campaigns has helped develop standout guard, Jerica Coley. Coley earned AP All-America honors in 2011-12 after becoming the first player in FIU women's basketball history to be named SBC Player of the Year. Under Thomas Bateast's direction, Coley joined the 1,000-Point Club as a sophomore, becoming the sixth player in program history to achieve 1,000 career points in two seasons.

In 2011-12, Thomas Bateast helped lead FIU (23-11) to its first 20-win campaign in the last 10 years as the Panthers posted their second-straight, 10-win Sun Belt Conference season and advanced to their second-consecutive SBC Championship semifinal. FIU would then earn an at-large bid to the Postseason WNIT, advancing to the postseason event for the first time since 2005-06.

Thomas Bateast's primary responsibilities at FIU include but are not limited to the coordination of all aspects of recruiting Division I student-athletes, assisting with on-court coaching, assisting practice and game preparation, opponent scouting, promotion and coordination of Cindy Russo's Global Basketball Camps, Inc., and individual instruction and player development with special emphasis on the guard positions.

Prior to her arrival at FIU, Thomas Bateast served as an assistant coach at the University of Rhode Island for two seasons. During her time at URI, she helped guide the Rams to a second-place finish in the Atlantic 10 Conference East Division in 2004-05, the program's best finish since 1995-96. Her responsibilities included recruiting, player evaluation, opponent scouting, individual instruction and player development, practice and game preparation, and overseeing team academic progress.

Before joining the URI women's basketball staff, Thomas Bateast served as an assistant coach at Dillard University in New Orleans, La., for two seasons. Under her leadership, the Lady Blue Devils captured back-to-back Gulf Coast Athletic Conference Tournament crowns.

A two-time All-BIG EAST Third Team selection at the University of Miami, Thomas Bateast scored 1,284 points over her four seasons (1992-97) to rank 11th on the school's all-time list. The Hurricanes' all-time leader in both three-point field goals made and three-point field goals attempted, Thomas Bateast also holds UM's single-game record for most free throws made (18) and attempted (22).

Upon graduating from UM in 1997 with a bachelor's of business administration in sports management., Thomas Bateast joined the Phoenix Mercury of the WNBA in 1997 and went on to play in Italy, Sweden and Turkey before returning to the United States to play for the Birmingham Power of the NWBL in 2002.

Since the opening of U.S. Century Bank Arena on Feb. 1, 1986, opponents have quickly discovered that winning basketball games in South Florida is no easy task. Including winning the first three games at the arena to close out the 1985-86 season, the FIU women's basketball team has amassed an impressive 302-105 actual record at home, for a .668 winning percentage. The Panthers were undefeated at home in 1994-95 (14-0) and in 1997-98 (18-0), and have won 10-or-more home games in all but five seasons since the arena opened.

While playing in the Trans America Athletic Conference from 1991-98, the Panthers won 51 of 52 conference games at home. They have continued that success as a member of the Sun Belt Conference, putting together a perfect 7-0 record at home in 2001-02 and going an impressive 6-1 (.857) in home league games during 2005-06.

The Panthers won their arena debut with a 109-35 rout of Edward Waters College on Feb. 8, 1986. Other noteworthy victories include the program's 100th win in the Arena, a 104-51 decision over Valparaiso on Dec. 20, 1993, and the program's 200th victory in the Arena, an 83-59 win over New Mexico State on Feb. 8, 2001. Head Coach Cindy Russo won her 500th and 600th career games in the friendly confines of the USCBA -- a 74-57 win over Stephen F. Austin on Nov. 9, 2001 and a 70-60 win South Alabama on Feb. 16, 2006.

In December of 2011, construction on the east side of USCBA was completed, featuring 11,000 square-foot addition which includes added concessions, box offices, restrooms, meeting rooms and merchandising areas. The addition also features two 1,000 square-foot gameday suites.

The main court at USCBA is a Cincinnati Robbins perma-cushion maple wood basketball floor, made up of some 19,000 square-feet of wood. Four retractable basketball backboards allow for the floor to be divided into two practice courts, while Spalding portable basketball standards are used for intercollegiate competition. The arena has an overall seating capacity of 5,000.

The facility added a brand-new scoreboard and video board in the spring of 2011. At 24 feet by 16 feet, the state-of-the-art Daktronics scoreboard features a 14 feet by 9 feet video board which has the capability to show highlights and advertisements, becoming a major part of the gameday experience at U.S. Century Bank Arena. Support areas at USCBA include an equipment room, training room and eight full-service dressing rooms. Academic space in the building includes three classrooms, and physiology, computer and kinesiology laboratories.

In the summer of 2010, construction on the athletic locker rooms took place. The crown jewel of that project was the completion of the men's and women's basketball locker rooms. Each NBA-quality locker room is 2,000 square-feet and feature a team meeting room and separate coaches locker rooms. The U.S. Century Bank Arena also houses offices and board rooms for FIU athletic administrators and a state-of-the-art, 4,500 square-foot athletic training center that opened in the fall of 2006. The facility features a hydrotherapy room, which includes custom-built, underground hot and cold plunge pools and a therapy pool with an underwater treadmill, a doctor's examination room, functional training area, rehabilitation area with 12 treatment tables, and an audio-visual system that includes high definition and flat screen televisions for comfort and convenience.

A full array of activities have taken place in this 94,000 square-foot multi-purpose facility. Sporting events, concerts, banquets, trade shows, graduations, convocation ceremonies and other University and community events have all been accommodated. In the fall of 2005, the Dalai Lama addressed the University community in a private lecture at U.S. Century Bank Arena, and in the fall of 2012, President Bill Clinton addressed the FIU community. The arena was the summer home of the NBA's World Champion Miami Heat for three years, and twice hosted rookie tournaments featuring the Heat and three other NBA organizations. In addition, the 2011 South Florida All-Star Classic, featuring nine NBA All-Stars, was held at USCBA.

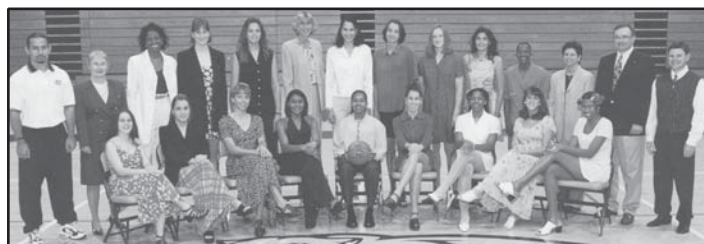

JENNIFER BELL

Colorado Xplosion (ABL), 1997

ALBENA BRANZOVA

PROFESSIONAL: Drafted in the third round by the WNBA's New York Liberty in 1998... Played in 11 games, averaging 2.1 points and 1.5 rebounds... Scored a career-high five points versus the Utah Starzz... Continued to play professionally in the EuroLeague with Nadezhda Orenburg in Russia.

COLLEGE: A two-time All-American, Branzova played from 1991-95... Was the first of three players to have a jersey retired by the Panthers... Competed in two NCAA Tournaments and two WNIT Tournaments... Scored 26 points to help give FIU its first NCAA Tournament victory with an 81-76 win over Old Dominion... Remains the program's scoring leader with 2,515 points—including a school-record 45 points versus Marquette on March 27, 1993, and continues to rank first in career field goals (1,033), career field goal percentage (.607), career three-point field goal percentage (.416), and career rebounds (1,092)... At time of graduation, was one of just two players in the state of Florida to reach the 2,000-point, 1,000-rebound plateau... A three-time All-TAAC selection, was named to the Atlantic Sun Conference's (formerly the TAAC) 25th Anniversary Team.

GERGANA BRANZOVA

PROFESSIONAL: Selected by Detroit in the third round of the 1998 WNBA Draft... Played in 26 games, averaging 2.7 points and 1.6 rebounds... Scored a career-high 11 points versus Washington... Averaged 13.8 points and 10.7 rebounds over six games in the 2008 European Championships with Bulgaria... Continues to play professionally in Europe with the Turkish team Fenerbahce Istanbul.

COLLEGE: A two-time All-TAAC selection, Branzova played for FIU from 1994-98 and earned second team All-America honors as a senior... Finished her career with 1,339 points which ranks ninth in FIU history... Currently ranks first in career free throw percentage (.811), second in career field goal percentage (.578), seventh in career blocked shots (74) and 10th in career free throws (245)... In 1998, she averaged 17.3 points per game and finished eighth in the NCAA in field goal percentage (.620)... Became just the 15th player in FIU history to record at least 500 points in a single season when she had 537 as a senior.

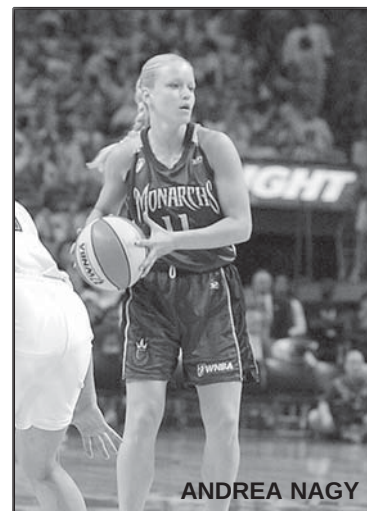
DALMA IVÁNYI

PROFESSIONAL: In 2006, Iványi ranked second in the EuroLeague in assists, averaging 5.7 per game and a team-high 6.2 rebounds and 11.9 points per outing for MiZo-Pécs... In 2005, signed a free-agent contract with the WNBA's San Antonio Silver Stars, making 14 starts in 30 games played... Averaged 2.5 points and 2.3 assists per game, while shooting a team-high 44.4 percent from three-point range... In 2004, selected to the All-Star Five after leading MiZo-Pécs to the FIBA EuroLeague Women's Final Four for the second-straight season... Started the 2003 season with the Phoenix Mercury after playing in Europe the previous three years... One of only 10 college players taken in the 1999 draft, picked in the fourth round by the Utah Starzz... Started 16 games in 2002, playing in 27... Averaged 3.4 points, 2.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game... Dished out a game-high seven assists and grabbed a game-high four steals in Utah's win over Seattle... In 1999, played in 14 games, averaging 0.8 points and 0.5 assists... Played for the Hungarian National Team at the EuroBasket Final Round in 1997, 2001 and 2003.

COLLEGE: A two-time All-American, Iványi played from 1995-99... One of three FIU players with a jersey retired by the Panthers... Competed in three NCAA Tournaments... In the program's career record book, ranks first in steals (376), second in assists (896) and sixth in points (1,499) ... As a senior, averaged 15.0 points, 3.8 rebounds and 8.8 assists per game, shooting 40.6 percent from three-point range to garner third team All-America honors by the Associated Press... 1998 Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year and 1997 Trans America Athletic Conference Player of the Year... In 2005, named to the Sun Belt Conference's 30-Year Anniversary Team.

ANDREA NAGY

PROFESSIONAL: Nagy played professionally for seven seasons before retiring in 2003... Traded by the New York Liberty to the Sacramento Monarchs at the beginning of 2002 season... Started eight games with the Monarchs, averaging three assists per game in 24 appearances... Ranked third in the league with 7.1 assists per 40 minutes average... Selected by the Mystics in the third round of the 1999 WNBA Draft... In two seasons with the Washington Mystics, started every game she played... The 2000 season was highlighted by 10-assist performance against Sacramento, leading to a fifth-place finish overall in assists (118)... Started 23 games, averaging 4.2 points, 2.7 rebounds and 5.1 assists... In 1999, started all 32 games, finishing seventh in the league in assists, averaging 4.6 per game... Also averaged 5.1 points and shot 76.3 percent from the free throw line... In 1996, Seattle selected Nagy in the fourth round of the ABL Draft... Played in 39 games and finished second on the team in assists (113), fifth in steals (34) and ninth in scoring (3.8)... In 1997, played for Long Beach, leading the Stingrays to the finals... Finished third in the league in assists (273) and averaged 7.6 points per game.


ANDREA NAGY

COLLEGE: One of the greatest players in school history, Nagy played for FIU from 1991-95... One of three players with a jersey retired by the Panthers... Helped FIU to two NCAA Tournament appearances and finished her career averaging 14.5 points, 3.6 rebounds and 9.4 assists—the fourth-best assist average in NCAA history... Her 1,165 assists are second-best all-time in NCAA history and an FIU record... Ranks fourth in school history with 1,812 career points... Led the nation in 1994 with 10.3 assists per game and was selected first team All-America by Kodak, United States Basketball Writer's Association and USA Today... Named to the Atlantic Sun Conference's (formerly the TAAC) 25th Anniversary Team.

LYNETTE RICHARDSON

Miami Tropics (USBL), 1987

GERGANA SLAVTCHEVA

PROFESSIONAL: Played 2003 season in the WNBA with the Phoenix Mercury... Was drafted in the second round by the Los Angeles Sparks in 2002—the highest round of any FIU player picked in the WNBA Draft.

COLLEGE: The queen of three-point range, Slavtcheva played at FIU from 1998-2002... Set the previous school record for three-point baskets made in a season with 57 as a sophomore... Broke that mark the following season, hitting 58 from beyond the arc... Reigned as all-time school leader in three-pointers made (172) and attempted (492) for eight years... Produced two career triple-doubles... Left FIU third in points (1,823), fifth in rebounds (729), tied for fourth in assists (376) and seventh in steals (188)... Three-time All-Sun Belt Conference honoree, five-time SBC Player of the Week and three-time tournament MVP... Averaged 15.2 points, 6.3 rebounds and 3.1 assists per game... Posted double-figure points in 82 games and scored 20 or more points 35 times... In 2005, named to the Sun Belt Conference's 30-Year Anniversary Team.
