FIU Season Headlines

- The season's third contest vs. No. 23 Bethune-Cookman marks the second of a two-week, two-game home-stand at Alfonso Field at FIU Stadium. The Panthers will travel to seventh-ranked Louisville next Saturday, Sept. 21, before their inaugural Conference USA schedule begins on the road at Southern Miss, Oct. 5.
- FIU's back-to-back HOME games vs. Florida schools (UCF and Bethune-Cookman) marks the first time that occurrence has occurred for FIU and just the third time the Panthers have faced Sunshine State programs in back-to-back games.
- After two games, 17 Panthers have made their first career starts. In the season-opener at Maryland (Aug. 31), a school-record 13 FIU players logged their debut start in the blue and gold. For the season, eight offensive players have made first-career starts, seven defensive players and both kicker and punter.
- Still critical to mention, as far as returning starters and players who logged at least one career start, FIU appears to have the youngest roster in the nation. The opening day ACTIVE roster featured 22 players with a combined 122 career starts. Those 22 players also included just four primary starters from the 2012 season (one on offense and three on defense). Take into account, FIU had the most veteran roster in the nation in 2012 with 55 players, including more than 30 seniors, with a combined 762 career starts.
- FIU's 2013 schedule has been tough, to say the least. According to TeamRankings.com, which measures schedule strength, the Panthers have played the 16th toughest non-conference schedule thus far. FIU's four non-conference opponents are a combined 8-0 on the season heading into week No. 3. Upcoming, FCS Bethune-Cookman are the reigning MEAC champion, while No. 8 Louisville was last season's BIG EAST Champion.
- The 2013 season marks FIU's first in Conference USA and will officially open up league play Oct. 5 at Southern Miss. The Panthers play in the league's East Division along with East Carolina, Florida Atlantic, Marshall, Middle Tennessee, Southern Miss and UAB. The C-USA Championship Game versus the West Division champion is scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 7.
- Ron Turner** was named FIU's head football coach on Jan. 4, 2013, bringing with him an outstanding resume from the collegiate and professional levels. Turner's 36 seasons in coaching have included nine as a head coach with Illinois and San Jose State. Along with Turner, this year's staff boasts a veteran 194 combined years coaching football.

FIU - Bethune-Cookman: The Series

- Game No. 3 vs. FCS No. 23 Bethune-Cookman, Saturday, Sept. 14, at Alfonso Field at FIU Stadium marks the renewal of one of FIU's oldest football rivalries. The Wildcats, along with annual opponent, Florida Atlantic, were on the Panthers' inaugural 2002 schedule.

- The two-game series renewal with Bethune-Cookman will continue with another game to be played at Alfonso Field at FIU Stadium in 2014.
- The two teams first squared off during FIU's first two seasons playing football in 2002 and 2003. The Panthers played at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) for its first three seasons before transitioning to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2005.
- In the first meeting, dubbed the South Florida Football Classic, played at Ft. Lauderdale's Lockhart Stadium, saw the 24th-ranked Wildcats dominate in the first half scoring 14 of their 31 points en route to the shutout victory.
- The first game was defined by the Wildcats rushing performance and stifling defense. Of Bethune-Cookman's 496 total offensive yards, 317 were rushing yards. Three of four touchdowns were rushing scores. Future NFL star and 2002 Buchanan Award winner (FCS MVP) Rashean Mathis would also add a touchdown in the second quarter off a 26-yard fumble recovery.
- Defensively, Bethune-Cookman, that season's eventual MEAC Champion, recorded 12 sacks, 15 tackles for loss overall, four forced fumbles and two interceptions. FIU would net minus-16 yards rushing for the game.
- Bethune-Cookman, holding a No. 7 national ranking during the week of the 2003 game, came to Miami scored a 24-14 victory. Similar to the 2002 game, the Wildcats started quickly, blanking FIU 17-0 going into the half.
- The two teams combined for four rushing touchdowns, three by the Wildcats, while the field goal kickers added the rest of the scoring. B-CU running Rodney Johnson was the offensive star of the game with 19 carries for 108 yards rushing, one catch for 32 yards and a touchdown.
- FIU would next play MEAC school Florida A&M in 2004 and 2005, before discontinuing its schedule with FCS opponents until this season's Bethune-Cookman game.

FIU / Ron Turner vs. the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference

- FIU renews competition with a MEAC opponent for the first time since hosting Florida A&M during the 2005 season. The Panthers have played four games against the MEAC, including **Bethune-Cookman (0-2)** and **Florida A&M (2-0)**. Both wins versus the Rattlers were vacated with all program victories recorded from 2003-05.

- Three of the four games against the MEAC came when FIU was playing in the Football Championship Subdivision.

FIU Coaches vs. B-CU Head Coach Brian Jenkins

- Bethune-Cookman head coach **Brian Jenkins** has faced several current FIU coaches either while he was a standout student-athlete at the University of Cincinnati or later in his career as an assistant coach.
- In his first two seasons playing at wide receiver and running back for Cincinnati, 1990-91, Jenkins played against East Carolina, which included current FIU Run-Game Coordinator/Offensive Line Coach **Steve Shankweiler** as the Pirates' Co-Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line Coach. Shankweiler's Pirates defeated the Bearcats on both occasions 56-32 and 30-19, respectively.
- In 2006, while Jenkins was serving at Louisiana-Lafayette as an assistant coach, the Ragin' Cajuns dropped a 51-7 decision at Texas A&M, where current FIU running backs coach **Andrew Hayes-Stoker** was in his final season as an offensive quality control graduate coach. Later the same season, ULL fell at home to Middle Tennessee, 34-20, where current FIU Defensive Secondary Coach **Jason Brooks** was a student assistant coach.

Unique History Made with UCF Game

- The UCF game marked the first FBS non-conference game this season involving two schools that changed leagues for the 2013 season.
- FIU moved from the Sun Belt to Conference USA, while UCF moved to the American Athletic Conference from C-USA.

Coincidentally, two other FIU non-conference opponents, Maryland and Louisville, will be changing conference affiliation for 2014. Maryland is moving from the Atlantic Coast Conference to the Big Ten. Louisville is going from the American Athletic Conference to the ACC.

FIU and the Sunshine State

- In its 12-year history, FIU has played against eight of 10 football-playing schools in Florida.
- FIU will play three Sunshine State schools in 2013 (Sept. 6 vs. **UCF**, Sept. 14 vs. **Bethune-Cookman** and Nov. 29 at **Florida Atlantic**). The three in-state opponents' tie for the most played in a single FIU season. It has happened three other times in program history (2002, 2003 and 2006).
- The back-to-back home games vs. Florida schools marks the **first time that occurrence has occurred for FIU and just the third time the Panthers have faced Sunshine State programs in back-to-back games all-time**. The last time was in 2009, FIU traveled to top-ranked Florida in the 11th game before closing the year at home vs. Florida Atlantic.
- FIU has played **Bethune-Cookman** (0-2), **Florida** (0-1), **Florida A&M** (0-0/2-0#), **Florida Atlantic** (2-8/3-8#), **Jacksonville** (1-0/2-0#), **Miami** (0-2), **UCF** (1-2) and **USF** (0-2).
[# - wins from 2003-05 were vacated].
- The only state schools FIU has not faced are Florida State and Stetson, which just brought back its football program in 2013.

FIU Youth Movement in 2013

- A week after having a school-record 13 first-time starters, another four Panthers made their first debut starts vs. UCF. **This season 17 players have earned their first career starts, including eight on offense, seven on defense and two special teams (kicker and punter).**
- Since moving up to the Football Bowl Subdivision in 2005, the 17 players (albeit after only two games), **now ranks as the fifth-most among the Panthers' nine all-time FBS seasons.**

- The Panthers' seven first-time starters on offense at Maryland were also a program-high. Six was the previous high on offense set against Middle Tennessee in the 2006 season-opener.

Special Teams Notes

- **Chris Ayers** (P) is the first new punter for the Panthers since former player **Josh Brisk** handled the majority of FIU's punts during the 2010 season.
- In his second game vs. UCF, he punted 10 times, which ties for the second-most in a single-game. His nine punts at Maryland now tie for fifth all-time.
- Ayers had the top two statistical games by an FIU punter, with nine punts for 367 yards and 10 punts for 344 yards.
- **Sergio Sroka** (PK) struck the first points of the 2013 season with a 32-yard field goal. Sroka also was successful on his first extra-point attempt. Sroka also handled kickoffs, marking the first new kicker for FIU as former player **Jack Griffin** handled all kicking duties since the 2009 season.

Career Starter Analysis

- FIU had one of the nation's most veteran rosters in 2012, as one of four schools returning more than 30 seniors along with 52 players combining for 762 career starts (including 79 appearances from the kicker and punter).
- At the start of the 2013 season, FIU finds among the youngest teams in the nation, as far as career starts go. The **ACTIVE** FIU roster returns only 22 of those 52 student-athletes from 2012. **Those 22 combine for 122 career starts (just 16 percent of last year's total).** Overall, the program lost 30 players with a combined 640 career starts (or 84 percent of last year's total).

- Coached wide receivers for the 2010 AFC South Champion Indianapolis Colts.
- Offensive Coordinator for the 2006 NFC Champion and Super Bowl XLI participant Chicago Bears.

One of 11 Programs with a New Staff in 2013

- Of the 31 schools that hired new head coaches for the 2013 season, 11 have employed an entirely new coaching staff:

Auburn, California, Cincinnati, Colorado, FIU, Georgia State, Kentucky, Purdue, South Florida, Tennessee and Western Kentucky.

- Six others retained at least one coach (Arkansas, Boston College, Idaho, North Carolina State, Southern Miss and Western Michigan, while the remaining 14 kept two or more former assistants).

More About FIU's Returning Lettermen...

- Outside of the quarterback, the majority of last year's production did not return.
- The top two quarterbacks return, **Jake Medlock** and **E.J. Hilliard**, who combined for 2,772 of the team's 2,861 passing yards (97 percent).
- Six players return who combined for 322 of the team's 1,744 rushing yards (18.5 percent). **Medlock is actually the leading returning rusher with 236 yards.**
- 10 players return who combined for 508 of the team's 2,861 receiving yards (18 percent).
- Six return who combined to score 44 of the team's 300 points (15 percent). **Only two returning players had two or more touchdowns in 2012.**
- Minus the two quarterbacks (3,031 yards), only three other players return who combined for 63 total offensive yards.
- 15 players return who combined for 1,404 of the team's 6,325 all-purpose yards (22 percent).
- 18 players were lost who combined for 486 of the team's 795 total tackles (61 percent).
- FIU returns 639 of 1,782 combined return yards [punt, interception, kick and fumble] (36 percent).
- FIU did lose 100 percent of its field goal and extra points and 99 percent of its punting.

- FIU previously played eight seasons in the Sun Belt (2005-12), winning the league title in 2010 (Little Caesars Bowl) and 2011 (Beef 'O' Brady's St. Petersburg Bowl). The first three seasons of FIU football (2002-04) were at the FCS level.

Head Coach Ron Turner - First Season



Ron Turner was named FIU's head football coach on January 4, 2013, bringing with him an outstanding resume coaching at the collegiate and professional levels.

Turner's 36 years in coaching have included nine as a head coach with Illinois and San Jose State. During his 24 previous seasons in college football, Turner's career was highlighted with participation in eight bowl games: Rose, Fiesta, Sugar, Aloha, Citrus and Micron PC.

After he led an impressive turnaround at the University of Illinois, which resulted in the school's 2001 Big Ten championship, the league unanimously voted him that season's Big Ten Coach of the Year.

In 12 seasons coaching in the National Football League, Turner spent the majority of those seasons with the Chicago Bears, in addition to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Indianapolis Colts.

His NFL resume includes being named the 1995 Pro Football Weekly Assistant Coach of the Year; four playoff appearances; Offensive Coordinator during the Bears' 2006 NFC Championship and Super Bowl season; an assistant with the Colts' 2010 AFC South title team; quarterbacks coach with a 2012 Tampa Bay squad that netted team records for total yards, passing yards and passing touchdowns.

Prior to becoming FIU's third all-time head football coach last January, Turner the previous season with the Buccaneers where he coached quarterback Josh Freeman to franchise records in passing yards (4,065) and passing touchdowns (27). In just one season with the Bucs, Turner helped Tampa Bay amass team records in total yards (5,820) and total points scored (389).

Turner spent the two previous seasons with the Colts coaching quarterbacks in 2011 and wide receivers in 2010.

Overall, Turner coached for nine seasons in Chicago. For five years, 2005-09, he was Lovie Smith's offensive coordinator. From 1993-96, four seasons, Turner was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Dave Wannstedt.

In between his time with the Bears, Turner spent eight seasons as head coach at the University of Illinois (1997-2004), where he is the fourth-winningest coach in school history. Turner guided the Illini to two bowl bids, the Big Ten Championship in 2001 and a BCS Bowl bid to the Nokia Sugar Bowl.

In 2001, Turner was the unanimous selection for Big Ten Coach of the Year. He would preside over three of the top-six offenses in Illini history in terms of total yards, while four of his eight squads ranked in the school's top-11 for scoring. The 2001 unit had a school-record 390 points. Three of the top-six all-time leading rushers at Illinois and three of the school's top-10 all-time leading receivers played under Turner, as he helped place more than 20 players on NFL rosters.

The championship run in 2001 marked many firsts for the Illini. It was the first outright Big Ten title for Illinois in 18 years and the teams' first-ever berth in the Bowl Championship Series. The 10-win season was only the fourth for an Illini squad in its storied history.

For his efforts, Turner was unanimously named the 2001 Big Ten Coach of the Year. He also was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, Bear Bryant and the AFCA Coach of the Year awards. Illinois' No. 7 ranking in both the Associated Press and coaches' poll at the end of the regular season was the highest for an Illini squad since 1990. The team finished No. 12 in both final polls.

Aside from mentoring several notable quarterbacks at the NFL level, Turner is also known for his development of college quarterbacks.

At Illinois, Turner tutored Kurt Kittner, who was a Johnny Unitas Award finalist and a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist.

Kittner became one in a long line of successful Turner-coached quarterbacks at the college level including: John Congemi (Pittsburgh), Jeff Garcia (San Jose State), Rodney Peete (Southern California), Bucky Richardson (Texas A&M), Sean Salisbury (Southern California), Sandy Schwab (Northwestern) and Steve Stenstrom (Stanford).

Prior to the Bears, Turner coached for one season at San Jose State in 1992. In just one season at San Jose State, Turner led a remarkable turnaround, leading

the Spartans to a 7-4 record and a second-place finish in the Big West Conference. Turner guided San Jose State to its best record in six years and directed a potent offense that churned out 400 yards per game while averaging 30 points per contest, good for 15th in the nation.

Turner was a second-team junior college All-America wide receiver at Diablo Valley Community College and was inducted into the school's athletic Hall of Fame in 2009. He then earned a scholarship at Pacific, where he led the Tigers in receiving in 1975 and 1976.

Turner's sons Morgan and Cameron followed in their father's footsteps with Morgan coaching tight ends at Stanford and Cameron joining his father as wide receivers and quarterbacks coach at FIU.

Older brother, Norv, is one of the most respected offensive coaches in the NFL. Norv has been head coach for the San Diego Chargers, Oakland Raiders and Washington Redskins and has coordinated the offenses for the Cleveland Browns, San Francisco 49ers, Miami Dolphins and Dallas Cowboys.
