40th Annual FIU Pat Bradley Invitational

FIU women's golf will host the 40th Annual FIU Pat Bradley Invitational, Sunday through Tuesday, Oct. 22-24, at the Lakewood Ranch Golf and Country Club just outside Sarasota, Fla. There will be 15 teams in the 2017 field, playing 54 holes in the three-day tournament. Selected teams will be allowed to bring individuals. The Cypress Links course will be set up for a par 72 and 6,288 yards.

Tournament Field (15)

There will be 15 teams at the 40th FIU Pat Bradley Invitational, including: FIU, Boston College, Cincinnati, Eastern Michigan, Florida Atlantic, Florida Gulf Coast, Georgia State, Jacksonville, Morehead State, Southern Miss, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, UMKC, USF, WKU and Wyoming.

Format

Count the low four scores of the five players in the lineup. Selected teams have been granted individual players, but they do not count toward the team score. Sunday and Monday will begin at 8:30 a.m. (Tee Times). Tuesday will begin with a shotgun start at 8:30 a.m.

End of day results for each round will be posted on BirdieFire.com, in addition to FIUSports.com.

Awards for the FIU Pat Bradley Invitational will be given to the winning team and second place finishing team. Medalist, runner-up and third place individuals will receive an award.

Overview



The 40th Annual FIU Pat Bradley Invitational is held in 2015 at the beautiful Lakewood Ranch Golf and Country Club just outside Sarasota, Fla., October 25-27

Hosted by FIU, the three-round, 54-hole tournament was played on the challenging par-72, 6,288-yard Cypress Links Course. Opened in 2001, the 18-hole, Arnold Palmer-designed course featured wide golf corridors and delivered a more forgiving and rewarding experience for golfers of all skill levels.

The 2017 event features 15 schools: FIU, Boston College, Cincinnati, Eastern Michigan, Florida Atlantic, Florida Gulf Coast, Georgia State, Jacksonville, Morehead State, Southern Miss, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, UMKC, USF, WKU and Wyoming.

History

The annual FIU Pat Bradley Invitational remains one of the nation's longest-running collegiate golf events.

Named after the golf icon and FIU's very first All-American, the "Pat Bradley" was initiated by FIU's first golf coach and women's golf pioneer Mary Dagraedt (1973-81), who began the event at the Hollywood Lakes Inn & Country Club in 1977.

In addition to Hollywood Lakes, the FIU Pat Bradley Invitational has been held at such prestigious course locations: The Club at Pelican Preserve in Ft. Myers; Miccosukee Golf & Country Club (former Miami National Golf Club); Doral Golf Resort & Spa - Great White and Blue courses; Wyndham El Conquistador Resort & Spa in Las Croabas, Puerto Rico; Miami International Links at Melreese Country Club; Country Club of Miami; Don Shula's Hotel & Golf Club (former Miami Lakes Resort); Key Biscayne Golf Links (current Crandon Golf at Key Biscayne); Kings Bay Yacht & Country Club (current Deering Bay Yacht & Country Club).

Since its inception over nearly 40 years ago, the FIU Pat Bradley Invitational has consistently drawn top-quality collegiate programs and players.

There have been 19 different team champions since 1977, led by FIU with nine titles, followed by Miami (7), South Florida (4), Florida (3) and Tulsa (2) as schools with multiple team championships.

Tournament medalists have represented 17 different schools, with FIU leading the charge at 12 individual titles, followed by Miami (5), Florida Atlantic (3), Florida (2) and South Florida (2) as schools with multiple winners.

FIU's Michelle Simpson (1997-00) stands as the only four-time winner of the event.

Countless NCAA Division I All-Americans have played in the FIU Pat Bradley Invitational over the years, many of whom went on to great success on the LPGA Tour.

Such notable participants from visiting schools have included: Meg Mallon (Ohio State), Dottie Pepper (Furman), Kelly Robbins (Tulsa) Carin Hjalmarsson-Koch (Tulsa), Donna Andrews (North Carolina), Deb Richard (Florida), Penny Hammel (Miami), Cindy Schreyer (Georgia), Kate Golden (Texas), Jackie Gallagher (LSU) Joan Pitcock (Tulsa), Patti Rizzo (Miami), Cathy Johnston North Carolina), Jean Bartholomew (Duke) and Tracy Kerdyk (Miami).

FIU's LPGA standouts have included Becky Pearson, Brenda Rego, Nancy Rubin-Sharff, Mary Beth Zimmerman, Terry-Jo Myers, Michelle Dobek, Moira Dunn and Simpson.

Pat Bradley

A standout collegiate golfer, who went on to unprecedented success on the LPGA tour, Pat Bradley is known as arguably the most consistent performer and dedicated individual in women's golf.

During her prime, Bradley competed in 627 tournaments, posting 312 top-10 finishes, with 208 of those in the top five. She became the first woman golfer to surpass the \$2 million (1986), \$3 million (1990) and \$4 million (1991) marks in career earnings and was the first woman to win all four of the modern major golf championships. In 1986, she won the Nabisco Dinah Shore, the LPGA Championship, the du Maurier and finished fifth at the U.S. Women's Open, three strokes out of the Jane Geddes-Sally Little playoff.



Bradley was one of the greatest players from one of the most competitive eras in LPGA Tour history and in 1991 she became the 12th women's golfer to be inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame.

FIU CAPTURES 39TH PAT BRADLEY INVITATIONAL



Two Panthers posted scores under par and FIU women's golf won its first tournament championship of the season with a 14-under (872) on Tuesday, October 25 at the 39th Pat Bradley Invitational at the Lakewood Ranch Golf and Country Club. Senior Camila Serrano (Bogota, Colombia) fired a bogey-free, final-round 4-under 68 to land in third overall at 7-under (69-72-68 209). It was one shot off the old tournament record of 208.

Serrano birdied her first hole, grabbed pars on the next 11 holes and finished with three birdies in her final six for the second-lowest score of the day.

"At the beginning of the round, I couldn't hole any putts," said Serrano. "I started feeling pressure because I didn't know how we were playing and I usually play better with a little pressure, and so with that extra focus, I started to make putts and I closed the round 2-under in the last three holes, which felt good. I am really proud of the team. Finally we can feel good together with this win. We have been syncing together this semester."

Freshman Carolina Rotzinger (Puebla, Mexico) also came in under par with a 1-under 71 to finish at 3-over (72-76-71 219) and in a tie for 13th.

Junior Katerina Krasova (Ricany, Czech Republic) was one stroke back, shooting a 1-over 73 in her final round Tuesday. She finished the tournament in a tie for 18th at 4-over (72-75-73 220).

Senior Coralia Arias (Quito, Ecuador), who won this event three years ago, was tied for 25th after a 5-over 77 to finish the event at 8-over (75-72-77 224).

The individual champion was Florida's Samantha Wagner, who set a new 18-hole Pat Bradley Invitational record with an 8-under 64 and also broke the 54-hole scoring record by six strokes as she finished 14-under par (67-71-64 202).

Cypress Links at Lakewood Ranch and Country Club

Cypress Links is one of three unique courses at the private Lakewood Ranch and Country Club. The course poses traditional challenges through bunkers, water, forced carries, hazards and length.

The private club opened on November 29, 2001 with the Cypress Links course. The King's Dunes course followed with its opening in March 2005, then Royal Lakes in 2007.

Cypress Links was designed with all skill levels in mind to be more forgiving, yet, it is quite challenging for the most skilled players measuring 6,288 yards.
